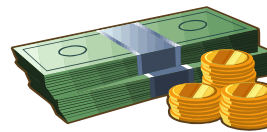


Our Lady of the Way

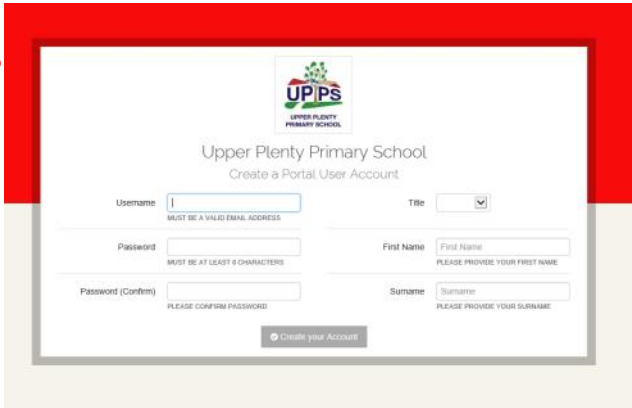

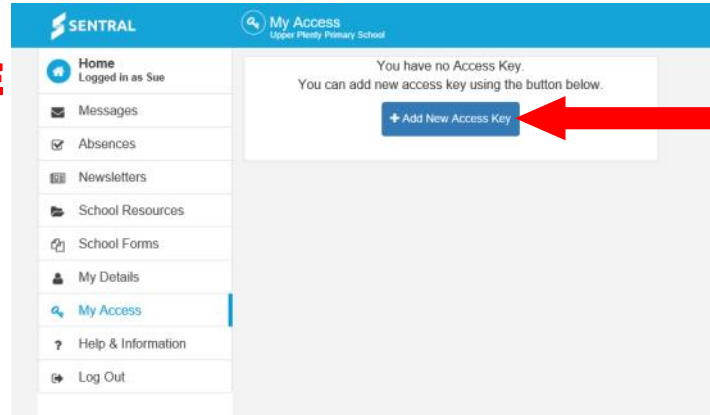
Sentral of Parents Registration Process

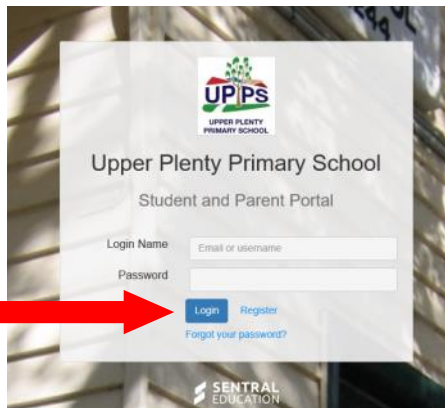
Step 2 and 3—Use a valid email address to create an account.

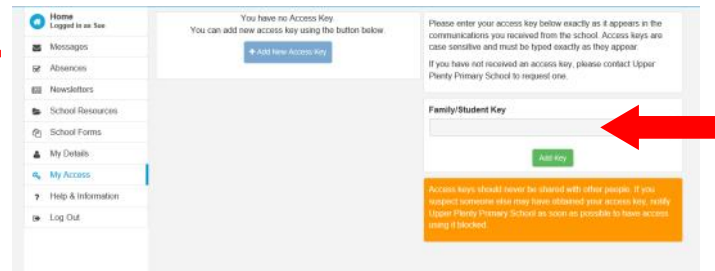
Step 6—Click the “ Add new Access key”

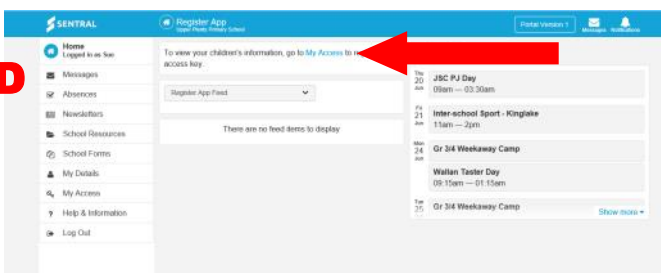
Step 4. Enter the email address and password you used in Step 2/3, click Login
