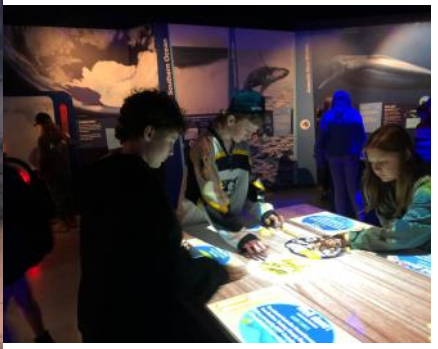
- collection of safety and other adaptive ear equipment, such as headphones, earbuds, earplugs, earmuffs and hearing aids.

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Window into 1/2B!

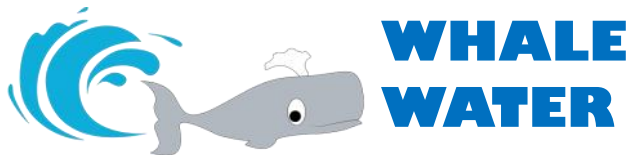
