

School-wide Positive Behaviour



This week's SWPBS value is follow teacher directions quickly.

This is a way of showing **respect**.

Students have been looking at how we can follow the teacher's directions when asked. They have been discussing this expectation by describing what it would look like and the steps to showing this expectation.

They have brainstormed ways they can improve on following teacher directions quickly.

Students have been learning that when we follow instructions given by an adult or teacher, it is for their safety, but also to maximise the learning opportunities students are participating in.

By following teacher instructions, it allows all students to feel safe and happy within the classroom, and enjoy what they are learning.

You can foster this at home by acknowledging and praising your child when they have followed an instruction given by you, and model the benefits of following adult instructions.







Conveyancing Allowance

To be eligible for a conveyance allowance a student attending a mainstream school must attend:

their nearest government school/campus appropriate to their year level — being the closest school determined by the shortest practicable route from the student's residence, or

the student's Designated Neighbourhood School (DNS) — refer to Find my School website to identifv a student's DNS

Students not attending their nearest government school or DNS may still be eligible under this criterion if they fall within any of the exceptions listed below.

The eligibility of any sibling of a student receiving or eligible to receive the conveyance allowance is assessed individually and will not be impacted by their sibling's eligibility.

Next nearest school

A student may be eligible for a partial allowance to assist with the cost of travel to their next nearest government school if:

- they reside 4.8km or more from their nearest government school
- private car is the only means of transport to the next nearest school

The partial allowance is set out in the chapter — Conveyance Allowance Rates.

Students who can access spare seats on a government funded school bus or public transport do not fall within this exception and are ineligible for a conveyance allowance.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary ter parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

\$150 for primary school students

\$250 for secondary school students

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

HOW TO APPLY

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.



Annual privacy reminder for our school community




