## Nillumbik Division Softball Debut – A Grand Slam Start!

On Thursday 30th October, our school proudly entered the School Sports Victoria Softball Championship for the very first time. Competing under the exciting "Fully Loaded" format—a modified version of traditional softball—the team embraced a fast-paced game where each inning began with runners already on base, all nine players batted each inning, and pitching rules were adjusted to keep the action flowing.

The day kicked off in spectacular fashion when Benji hit a grand slam (a home run with all bases occupied) on the very first pitch—an incredible start that set the tone for the rest of the tournament. Over three games, every player contributed by either getting a hit or helping bring runners home.

Our fielding was just as impressive. With smart decision-making and teamwork, players made crucial outs by throwing to the most strategic bases. Jaxen, Trey, and Finn rotated through key positions like first base, third base, and shortstop, consistently stopping the opposition. Mitchell and Oli took on the bulk of the pitching duties, racking up multiple strikeouts, while Xavier and Quinn bravely took on the role of catcher, making important plays at home plate. Benji and Jimmy covered the outfield with confidence and skill.

The team finished with two wins and one loss, ending in a three-way tie for first place. Unfortunately, we placed third overall missing out by just 4% based on the runs scored and conceded.

A special mention goes to Benji, who was outstanding with the bat, hitting **three grand slams**, driving in **14 runs**, and successfully batting in **six of seven innings**.


